

End of year review December 2022



200 days to go

The NatWest International Islands Games will be taking place in Guernsey 8-14 July 2023. 24 Member Islands of the International Island Games Association will be taking part in the Games and will be participating in 14 sports.

The Organising Committee and a large number of the volunteer team have been working hard behind the scenes for many months now. This is an overview of how the planning is going as we get ready to welcome some 3,000 people to our Guernsey shores next year.

Sports



14 sports will feature in the Guernsey Games, with over 220 events taking part during the week. We have been working closely with the Sports here in Guernsey and would like to thank all of the coordinators for the time and effort they have put in.

Our venues are in good shape and we have our first draft programme. Final numbers have to be submitted by the member islands by the 31 December, and the final programme of events will be available in early February.

We will be awarding over 1700 medals during the week. One particular highlight will be the triathlon relay on the final Friday as this will be the first time that this event has featured in the Games.
